Over the last two years, we have created a Chapter Resource Center on sapfm.org to provide guides, templates, and points of contact for our chapter leaders. Our recent efforts have focused on helping each chapter return to active status following the pandemic, which created many complications for

the chapters including loss of meeting space and turnover (or vacancies) among the chapter leaders. We're encouraged to see that thirteen chapters held meetings in spring 2023.

- 2. Website Committee: I'm an active member of this committee, under Keith Doney's leadership. In addition to recruiting additional members with experience in desktop publishing and design, I have contributed to the website by maintaining the "Upcoming Events" and "Announcements" portion, assisting Keith with build-out of the Phil Lowe digital library, as well as broader maintenance and design activities.
- Educational Grants Committee: I have contributed to this committee by providing recommendations and voting on grants decisions. I intend to continue in this role, as I view this to be one of the most important methods of achieving the SAPFM mission to advance the understanding, education, and appreciation of American period furniture.

WOODWORKING/FURNITURE BACKGROUND

I have a passion and love for period furniture and the preservation of the skills and advancement of the craft. I began woodworking in earnest in 2008, after attending my first SAPFM chapter meeting in Springfield, Virginia. That meeting sparked my interest in Baroque and Rococo styles, and since that time I have concentrated on filling my home with period reproductions. Of the pieces I have built, two pieces stand among my favorites: (1) my reproduction of a Benjamin Randolph side chair, which taught me to shape a cabriole leg (focus on the ankle and don't neglect the back of the leg) and carve a proper ball

and claw; and (2) a Philadelphia-style spice chest on stand with triphyd feet and crotch mahogany tombstone-style doors. I haven't attempted much in the Neoclassical/Federal style but am interested in expanding into this area in the future.

I particularly enjoy using the various period tools and techniques that were used in the period, and then slowly introducing modern methods or materials after convincing myself that they won't change the outcome.
